The January 12 edition of AutoWeek, which incidentally is now "Auto Bi-Week", had an article on which car you can buy that is "true-blue-American". Turns out none of them are. To try and get some idea, the author, Greg Migliore, considered autos built with American and Canadian parts to be "all American" The South Americans might have some quibble with that, but we will leave that topic to the talking heads.

The "Made in the USA" winner is... (drum roll here)..... the Veritable Ford Crown Victoria with 90% American parts. The next closest is the Toyota Sienna with 85%. The Toyota is built in Princeton, Indiana.
