

**Les Neidell** was in the holiday spirit with his hat that played music and waved the pom pom around. His wife Joan, just acted like




she had never seen him before in her life. In the kitchen it

## THE TOOL LIST

*Editors note: no doubt some of our male club members might have received a new tool for Christmas. Don sent along this informative list of tools and their uses in case you need some information about it's operation and the directions seem to have disappeared !*

**DRILL PRESS:** A tall upright machine useful for suddenly snatching flat metal bar stock out of your hands so that it smacks you in the chest and flings your beer across the room, denting the freshly-painted project which you had carefully set in the corner where nothing could get to it.

**WIRE WHEEL:** Cleans paint off bolts and then throws them somewhere under the workbench with the speed of light. Also removes fingerprints and hard-earned calluses from fingers in about the time it takes you to say, "Oh, shit!"

**SKILL SAW:** A portable cutting tool used to make studs too short.

University of Tulsa. Eric left Tulsa in 2004 to study the art of brewing in Munich, Germany where he was awarded the prestigious International Diploma in Brewing Technology from the World Brewing Academy. He apprenticed in multiple breweries

throughout Germany and served as a brewer at the Victory Brewing Company in Downingtown, Pennsylvania.

In 2007, Eric returned to Tulsa to begin laying the groundwork for his own brewery. Marshall Brewing Company, Tulsa's first production craft microbrewery, which



began operations in spring 2008. Marshall Brewing Company focuses on brewing full strength, hand crafted, top quality ales and lagers.

Eric was not there this evening but his father was happy to give us a tour and tell us about the art of beer making. Marshall's beer is available at Tulsa's bet-

ter eateries and pubs such as Michael Fusco's, the Chalkboard, Hideaway Pizza and McNeillies to name just a few. It can also be purchased in liquor stores locally. Next time you are up for a really good beer, have a mug from Marshall's.


