SANTA BROUGHT A BRAND NEW JAG!

Welcome back to another installment of proper detailing by Stuart Barrett. As we say goodbye to yet another year and take a moment to reflect on the automotive pursuits we've embarked upon, I can't help but look forward to the new year with great excitement! With a new year, can come a new car and what better way to begin proper care than when it's brand new?

You may be thinking to yourself, "It's a new car, why would it need a detail?" Let's wind the clock all the way back to the factory. With time constraints on production goals, the manufacturer enlists a quality control department that follows a guideline as to what is considered a "good" finish of the paint



surface. Oftentimes, sanding marks and buffing trails from both hurried and improper tool usage are overlooked for the sake of production. Once it gets the green light to ship to its destination, it is wrapped in various types of plastics that act as a buffer for any unforeseen encounter while it is en route. While the vehicle makes its journey on various freight platforms, it is exposed to harsh elements such as rail dust from trains and tar from roadways. Only after all that unwanted muck has found its way onto the new vehicle surface is it delivered to the dealership for its Post Delivery Inspection. This is where the vehicle is checked to make sure everything is compliant to the manufacturer's standards.



The car then gets handed over to the "detailing" department. This is the likeliest time the new vehicle could be subjected to damaging paint practices. Poor practices such as not using the correct product that is best suited for the vehicle; the worker not having correct training or equipment resulting in a subpar job with severe swirls; buffer trail marks; and even possible paint burn. Shortcuts, due to time constraints, rush the job and steps may even be skipped just to call the job done...

Fun fact: you can request a "new car delivery" where you receive the vehicle still in its wrapping before ever having visited the dealership's "detail" department. If you choose this path, you then have the option of the D.I.Y. route or taking it to a professional detailer for their new car preparation service. A quality new car prep includes: factory plastics and wrappings removal; the removal of any transportation and/or storage dirt; the removal of surface contaminants i.e., leftover adhesive, tree sap, rail dust, overspray, etc. Needless to say this is all done without marring or scratching the paint. It culminates to a professional inspection of the vehicle's paintwork, determining what's needed to bring out the full potential of the paint surface. I focus on increasing gloss and smoothness. Lastly, a durable protectant is applied to the surfaces using high quality sealants or coatings. Put your vehicle through this process and the results will impress you year after year of ownership. 
