JCNA ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Editors Note: Don McArthur is a long time member of our club who spends part of the year in Georgetown, Texas. This year he attended the AGM in San Antonio as the representative for our club and sent this report.

SAN ANTONIO AGM 2018

The AGM started off with a seminar on Friday that went through the new judging guide for the XK 120. I found it interesting and learned a little more about the 120. The guide was presented again at Saturdays meeting and voted on for a trial basis for 2018 with the idea that if all goes well it will be permanently approved in 2019.

The meeting itself started off with various reports showing JCNA is in good financial shape with about 5500 members which is about the same as last year. There was a vote on changing bylaws to allow for a shorter time period for voting on regional directors. This will help the Jaguar Journal with publication dates etc. What came out was only about 700 people vote on the directors and of those around 12% of those are not counted due to errors on the ballot. Of the ballots received in the last 10 days the error rate was about 70%! One of the reasons for the low voting rate is most regions only have 1 person running.

The meeting itself had very little discussion. The most interesting part of the AGM was the seminars. There was one put on by the Coventry Foundation. It has been "created by passionate Jaguar people with the goal of preserving the Marque for future generations". Donations are tax deductible. It seems a very worthwhile foundation and I would suggest that you take time and go to their website www.coventryfoundation.org to learn about it. The other seminar was on the head for the XK

engine. There were 18 engines heads on display, all different and they explained the various changes in each. Did you know you can pick up 25 HP in a 4.2 XKE by changing to a later fuel injected head even if you still use the carburetors?

San Antonio did an outstanding job of putting on the meeting. JCNA is looking for other clubs to hold meetings in future years. New Jersey is the host site for 2019.

LEAKE AUCTION CO. SOLD

Many club members have been attending the Leak auction, held in Tulsa in June, for many years. It was announced earlier this year that Ritchie Bros. has acquired the Leake Auction Company. Ritchie Bros. Auctioneers established in 1972, is an industrial auctioneer. The company is headquartered in Burnaby, a suburb of Metro Vancouver, and has 110 locations in 25 countries and 44 auction sites worldwide and is listed on the NYSE.

The Leake Auction Company is family owned and operated and was started by Jim Leake in Muskogee and Tulsa was the site of their first auto auction. Ritchie Bros. will retain all employees at the company, including Richard and Nancy Sevenoaks, to handle day-to-day operations going forward.

Also joining the Ritchie Bros./Leake team is Muffy Bennett, former Barrett-Jackson Division Manager and CEO of Bennett Automotive Specialists.

On May 31, 2017, the Company acquired Iron Planet for \$776.5 million and undertook the complex integration work, which resulted in some temporary sales productivity decline. Leake has been using Iron Mountain auction software for two years. The two companies have now officially come together to bring you the best in onsite unreserved auctions, online weekly auctions and reserved online marketplaces for selling and buying equipment. The next Tulsa auction is scheduled for June 7-10 at Expo Square.

HOW TO WASH YOUR CAR

Well, you would think everyone knows how to do that, right? Club members and invited guests from the Corvette Restorers group got a lesson in just how to do that from Stuart Barrett, a local detailing expert after breakfast on the first Saturday in March.

We were lucky and we had a nice day. As unpredictable and nasty as our weather has been, we weren't sure if we would be able to put water on a car without having it freeze! The demo was being held at the Young's house.

As the appointed hour rolled around David Beach from the Corvette group arrived in his lovely silver gray Corvette.

In the meantime Stuart was getting set up to demonstrate his car washing technique while members from the Jag club including **Todd**

Coady, Ken Snoke, Clark Frayser, Glenn Larson, Mike Webb, Greg Timo and Don Wright arrived. There were several member from the Corvette group and I am sorry that I did not get their names.

Stuart started off by cleaning wheels. First he looked at the cars that were here and decided that Greg's new Chevy had the dirtiest wheels so it was pulled up to the "wash bay".

Stuart uses only products that he has thoroughly studied and tested and if they don't meet his high quality standards, they don't get used. The products are also bio-degradable.

Tools are also important and he explained how he uses different cleaning cloths and how something that is used on the wheels is NEVER used on the body panels and vis-versa. The brushes used to get the cleaning products into every crease and crevice are incredibly soft. Yes, soft and pricey, but they last for years and still look new.



The product is sprayed on and then allowed to sit for a few minutes and then rinsed off and PRESTO! Clean Wheel! Sure beats the Q-tip method that is frequently employed on wire wheels!

Next he moved onto washing the body and "Prince", my '86 XJS V-12 was pulled up. Prince had been in the garage for nearly a year without a car cover and was very dusty. The first step is of course to look over the car and clean off any spots of road tar or squashed bugs or anything else that is dried or stuck hard onto the surface. Next the entire car is rinsed thoroughly and a full coat of foam is applied to everything; body panels, windows, wheels and tires.



The foam is allowed to sit and do its work of dissolving and encapsulating the dirt and dust.

Next step is rinsing with a high pressure stream of water to remove all the foam. If your car has a good protective coating on the paint, the water will form little droplets all over. Since Stuart had detailed this car about a year ago, it has that protective



coating and it was quite evident when Stuart fired up the leaf blower, yes, that right, a LEAF BLOWER and blew the water right off the car. Now all you have to do is wipe off the door sills and jambs, do a little wiping on the wheels and clean the windows and the car is sparkling clean and there are NO swirl marks or "love rubs" anywhere on the body because you never rubbed on it with a cloth, shammy, squeegee or anything else



that could mar the surface.

This is how you wash your car without touching it.

HEADIN' WEST ON OLD 66

Sunday April 22 dawned with gray skies and threat of rain for the first leg of our "Summer of Route 66" drive. But that did not stop the hearty few who showed up at Talley's Café (opened in 1987 on 11th St, old Rt 66) for breakfast to start our journey on a full stomach! There were 6 of us, Gary and Maxine Grover, AJ West, Mike Webb and Scott and Linda Young but between us we had 3 Jaguars!

As we walked to the parking lot discussing the lack of participation, the rain was increasing. But as Mike Webb, (native of Seattle said) "What the heck folks? It's only WATER!

Heading out old 66 we passed lots of landmarks, Bama Pie (1935), the Campbell Hotel (1927), the new "Mother Road Market at Lewis and 11th, the Tulsa Monument Building(1936), El Rancho Grande (1950), the Meadow Gold Sign (1929), the Warehouse Market (1929), Church of Christ Scientist (1902) and on to

This brought us to our first photo op, the Cyrus Avery Plaza.



Cyrus Avery, a Tulsa County Commissioner in 1926, is considered the father of Route 66 as he lobbied Congress to make it a national highway stretching from Chicago to Los Angeles.

The statues are 135% actual size and depict Cyrus Avery and his family in the Model T encountering a carriage from the West Tulsa oil fields.

We passed the Cities Service Station #88 (1926) and the Route 66 Village that features the 4500 Meteor Train engine and several cars, sailed by Ollies Station restaurant housed in a 1894 building and rolled to a stop at the Crystal City Shopping center where there is another 66 historical monument.



From here it was on to Sapulpa, home of Frankhoma Pottery and the Route 66 Car Museum that now has a great new gas pump out front!

Just out side of Bristow there are places where the road bed of the original road is still visible. Did you know there is an actual 50 foot chunk of the original Route 66 in the Smithsonian?

On to Stroud and the Rock Café. The owner of the café was the inspiration for the character "Sally" in the first Pixar film "Cars"

We didn't have time to drive through downtown Davenport to see the murals that are painted on the buildings depicting the towns history. Davenport also had the first natural gas spherical storage tank in the world.

We breezed by several other points of interest on our way to John Hargrove's place just east of Arcadia. John has a huge collection of 'stuff' and he has been featured in documentaries about route 66. Entering the long drive and up the hill to the

parking lot we passed the "Love Bus" and Johns custom motorcycle. This was only a tiny part of the treasure trove that is "John's Oklahoma County 66"

We stepped into the large building where John always had 2 or 3 projects going. Mostly he builds street rods and he does everything from customizing the body, painting, building the engine and doing all the upholstery, himself.

There are 3 connected buildings, one is his shop and the oth-



er 2 hold the vast collection of memorabilia and are set up to host private parties. There are glass doored cabinets filled with Coke-a-cola ad items that are very rare, pictures, posters, and artifacts of all kinds.

John was a pilot at one time so he and Mike Webb had a lot to talk about. John is currently building another hot rod from the frame up so he and Scott had a lot to talk about. Gary was thrilled to find a grill in a completed car that identifies the year of the car. This information will help his son pin point the year of a car he is working on at his home in California. John was happy to provide not only pictures of the correct grill but written conformation of the correct year.

An hour passed quickly and we had to leave to get to the next stop, the Round Barn in Arcadia.




