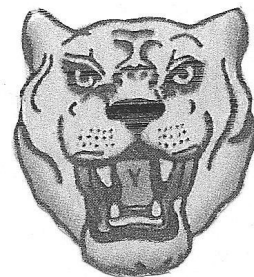

**Art Deco Tour - Tulsa - April 21**



If you have not been on one of the tours of Tulsa's Art Deco buildings, you are missing out on something quite spectacular. In the heyday of the oil barons architectural gems were built throughout downtown Tulsa and lucky for us, a large number of them have remained intact, been preserved and have become a famous tourist attraction.

Here our group stands in the lobby of the Mid Continent building.



We were fortunate enough to have a tour guide that was well versed in the history of these buildings and the people who built them which made the tour even more interesting.

We walked through the soaring spaces of the Philcade Tower which was built by

Waite Phillips, a Tulsa oil magnate who also built the Italianate home, Philbrook that he later donated to the city to become Philbrook Museum. The original building design was for 6 floors but by completion in 1931 it was 13 floors and in 1937 it became the first fully air conditioned building in Tulsa.

Waite had a twin brother, Wyatt, who unfortunately died at age 19 of an appendicitis. Every building that Waite built is adorned with the letter "WP". You will find it on door handles, engraved in stone work, embossed in metal in many places throughout the Phillips buildings. Some historians says it is in remem-



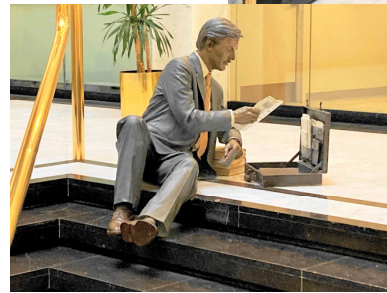
branch of Wyatt. Here the initials appear above an elevator door.



The Kennedy Building, which several of us had not be in before, has a atrium that will literally make you dizzy! There is a massive, 1,600-square-foot skylight that towers 135 feet above the floor of a the stunning white marble and shinning brass central lobby.

There is also interesting sculpture in the lobby.

Waite Phillips was one of the first to put in a tunnel from his office in the Philcade to the building across the street. This was



during the time when wealthy people worried about kidnappings and robberies. Today there are numerous tunnels under Tulsa's streets and we used several to access different buildings.

The Philtower building design is completely different than the Philcade. The soaring interior being almost cathedral like. was from here that we went through a tunnel to the Kenne-

building. Tulsa is full of interesting things to see and a rich history and this article doesn't do justice to everything we saw.

After our walk we were all ready to head to the Mother Road Market for lunch. If you haven't been there, it is quite the experience. First you will have to walk around deciding which cuisine you want to eat and that will take a bit of time itself! But everyone seemed to fine something so all was well.

(reported on CNN) [Car](#) enthusiasts will be able to get their hands on a rare Lancia B24 Spider America next month when an impressive fleet of 230 [classic cars](#) discovered in warehouses and an abandoned church in Holland comes up for auction.

The hoard of classic vehicles, believed to be worth millions of euros, belonged to Dordrecht businessman Ad Palmen, 82, who started collecting the cars 40 years ago, according to auction organizers.

Due to Palmen's reported ailing health, he could no longer keep the vehicles and they were recently purchased by Gallery Aaldering, a motor vehicle dealer run by Nico and Nick Aaldering, for an undisclosed amount.

"The Palmen Barnfind Collection" will go under the hammer in the Netherlands from May 19 as part of an auction organized by Gallery Aaldering and Classic Car Auctions.

Carlo Te Lintelo, Gallery Aaldering's head of marketing, told CNN on Friday that Palmen's trove, which includes a white Mercedes 300 S convertible, a blue Ferrari 365 and a modest Alfa Romeo Spider, was a closely guarded secret until a fire broke out at his largest warehouse last year. A quick response from the fire brigade prevented the cars going up in smoke. It is believed that Palmen has a deep appreciation for cars rather than a fondness for specific brands. Many of the models, including Maseratis, Jaguars, Aston Martins, BMWs and Facel Vegas, are in pristine condition, Te Lintelo said.

"These cars are in a great condition and immensely diverse. What you often see is people focusing on one brand when they are collecting cars like Mercedes Benz, Jaguar or BMW. Mr Palmen didn't collect just expensive or exclusive cars he bought everything he thought was beautiful," Te Lintelo said. He added: "This collection includes cars that are very special. Like the Lancia B4 Spider America. Just to give you an idea, that car alone will sell for €600,000 to €700,000 (\$660,000 to \$770,000). They are very rare, only a couple of them were made. If in perfect condition, they can sell for up to €1 million (\$1.1 million)."

According to Te Lintelo, there remains many unanswered questions about the collection because Palmen is too ill to tell his story.

"We have hundreds of questions about why he started collecting," Te Lintelo said. "So much mystery around the cars because he can't answer. [It's] very sad."



But there is one thing that Te Lintelo believes to be true: Cars were Palmen's passion.

"He was living in the warehouse and not in a luxurious

way. Cars were his life," he said. "We want to respect his legacy. This was his entire life. The Gallery Aldering brought the cars but we chose to name the collection after him to honor him."
